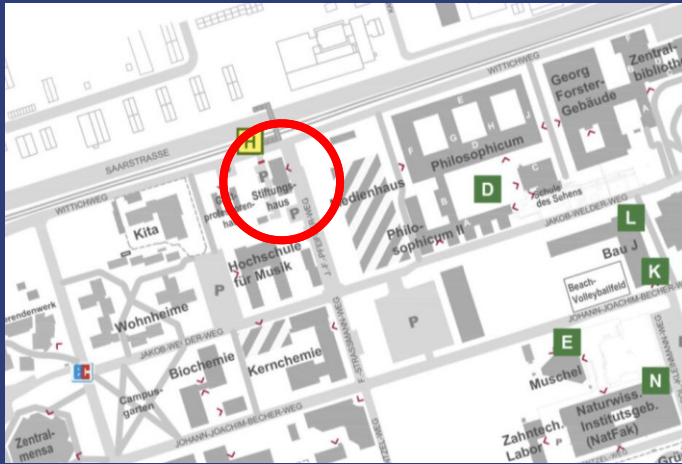


Directions

TEACHING SCOTLAND

TEACHING SCOTLAND aims to create a community of teachers of English wishing to explore Scotland's literature and culture in the classroom. With regular workshops we will create teaching resources and share best practice on lesson planning.

Following the Declaration of Intent signed by the governments in Scotland and Rheinland-Pfalz, we received seed money from the Scottish Government for our launch of TEACHING SCOTLAND in 2025, an initiative to increase the visibility of Scottish topics in secondary schools in Rheinland-Pfalz. We envisage to connect experts on Scottish Literature and Culture with education professionals of all levels.

We are delighted to host this year's workshop in honour of the late Lorna Borrowman Smith, a dedicated teacher and member of our partners at the *Association of Scottish Literary Studies* in Glasgow.

As part of her life's work she has created numerous teaching resources that are part of the Scotland Library here at JGU. These are displayed alongside the endowment of her extensive book collection which serves to strengthen the internationalisation of teacher education.

The TEACHING SCOTLAND workshop is part of an initiative to build a virtual community that brings together teachers of English with an interest in Scotland, so that they can explore topics related to Scotland and develop teaching resources together.
